7.2 Santa Cruz County College Commitment (S4C)

Dr. Cristine Chopra, Director of The Santa Cruz County College Commitment (S4C), gave a presentation about the program in light of Santa Cruz County College and Career Week. S4C is a collaborative of educators, administrators, and counselors including ten k-12 school districts, three colleges, and the County Office of Education. The goal of S4C is to increase post-secondary access and attainment for students in Santa Cruz County. S4C facilitates and organizes a variety of countywide programs and activities such as annual elementary and middle school visits to colleges, ongoing teacher professional development for mathematics and counseling, and cross-institutional mathematics articulation efforts.

Trustee Barr and Trustee Filicetti commended Dr. Chopra on her efforts and outcome of the program.

7.6 Data Initiative

The County Office of Education is embarking on an effort to create a countywide warehouse that would house student data from birth to career. In accordance with the Board's request at the August 15, 2019 meeting, the Superintendent Sabbah and Jason Borgen, Chief Technology Officer, presented additional details about the project and projected costs to the Board.
