a. CAC Chair

CAC sponsored Coffee Chats with resource providers - This program is intended to help parents get a better understanding of how resource providers work, what certain aspects of an IEP might mean and how parents can support their kids at home to help them get the most out of their services at school.

2. Kid Connection Zooms - Offering an additional opportunity for virtual socialization. These are themed, monitored meetings that will expand on the Kid Zooms that were intended to offer virtual child "care" alongside the Triple PPP parenting workshops that CAC provides. I am told the last workshop which is the first in a series regarding Parenting in Uncertain Times was well attended and had a lot of engagement.

3. Peer Navigator Program - We are in the beginning stages of coordinating a parent to parent support network for parents starting the IEP or 504 journey. The intention is to provide resources and support to parents to help them get the most out of the IEP process for their kids. We will be calling for volunteers from around the county and providing them with training to be able to help their peers understand the IEP process and how to work with their IEP team.

4. Universal Design Learning - We are looking to support and promote the further proliferation of an Universal Design Learning approach to teaching, by interacting with staff, parents and administrators to help them overcome obstacles to successful adoption. We are still gathering information on how best our energies can be spent in this regard.
