CTE Program Spotlight - Fire Technology



The Santa Cruz County Office of Education has been proudly providing students the opportunity to learn about a career in the Fire Technology Field for over two decades. Over the years, various local Firefighters have provided instruction and guidance to hundreds of students throughout the county. Currently, we

are proud to have both Fire Chief Rudy Lopez Sr and Firefighter, Richard Garcia leading our courses in both Watsonville and Santa Cruz.

Students participating in this course receive an introduction and understanding of fire service and operations. Topics will include an overview of the following: firefighter selection process, career opportunities, fire chemistry and physics, fire department resources, administration, support functions, training, fire prevention, fire protection systems, and



equipment, emergency incident management and operations. In addition, one of the many benefits of the Santa Cruz County Office of Education's Fire Technology course is the opportunity for high school students to earn college credit through our <u>articulated</u> courses*.

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Adult Learning Programs

The Santa Cruz County Office of Education is excited to offer Dental Assisting, Medical Assisting and Building Trades programs to help prepare adult students for the skills necessary to be successful in a future career. These hands-on programs will provide all participants to earn certifications and direct connections to industry experts.



Dental Assisting Program

The Santa Cruz County Office of Education is proud to offer a career pathway into a dental assisting career. Our program offers the student basic entry-level information, skills and clinical practice in all areas relating to the field of dental assisting.

Medical Assisting Program

This 10-month course teaches the necessary skills and knowledge needed to perform the duties of a medical assistant. Students participating will understand the role of both the administrative and clinical medical assistant.

CAC Updates



SANTA CRUZ COUNTY The Career Advancement Charter (CAC) is an Independent Study program for adult learners to earn their high school diploma while gaining academic and technical skills that will lead to college and career readiness.

Certification Pilot Program

The CALS team will be working with our CAC team to run a pilot certificate program in partnership with **Certiport**. This program will provide students the opportunity to complete curriculum in a variety of industry areas to help prepare them for certification exams. Students will be able to access all curriculum through the online format and receive ongoing support from their CAC instructor. The CALS team is looking at potentially making the COE a Certiport Testing Center as well to provide students ease of access for those looking to take the exams. Depending on the success of the Spring pilot, the CALS team may look at expanding this program next year.

CAC is excited to now offer Evening Learning Sessions

All students enrolled in the Career Advancement Charter high school diploma program will have the opportunity to participate in a variety of evening sessions/workshops. Sessions will run Monday through Thursday, from 5 pm to 7 pm. These are great opportunities for you to get direct assistance, develop your skills, and earn credit!

Practical Nurturing Support Group Kick-Off, 2/14/23

Our very own Vrinda Quintero, Blanca Corrales, and Edith Corrales are hosting a practical nurturing support group for new mothers on Tuesdays, from 5 pm to 6 pm. In this group, we will focus on the practical and emotional aspects of motherhood. This program, which will take place once a month, will continue until the end of the school year.

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The BACCC comprises 28 colleges and their framework is to facilitate, collaborate, plan, manage, communicate and inform their local education agencies (LEA's) about career education programs. It creates career pathways through collaborations with the K12 and Adult Education Consortia partners

to prepare students for high-demand, livable wages.

K12 Pathway Coordinator attended the Labor Market Information training to be able to support their LEA's, establish new career pathways, and apply for grants. Additionally, K12 PCs are learning how to score Strong Workforce Grants to better support their LEAs when applying for funds.
