The New Wildland Fire Academy





The Santa Cruz County Office of Education is proud to offer the opportunity to participate in our Wildland Fire Academy. Working in partnership with CAL FIRE and California Conservation Corps, students can complete training sessions needed for an entry-level firefighter position. Upon successful completion of the Wildland Fire Academy the student will receive fire service certifications, a SCCOE/CTE Certificate of

Achievement and eligibility to apply for California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (CAL FIRE). Students participating in this program will have the opportunity to earn certificates in the following:

- Firefighter 1C: Wildland
- NWCG L180 Human Factors in the wildland fire service
- NWCG S-130 Basic Wildland Fire Orientation
- S-110 Basic Wildland Fire Orientation
- NWCG S-190 Introduction to Wildland Fire Behavior

- FEMA IS-100B Introduction to Incident Command System
- FEMA IS-200 Basic Incident Command System for Initial Response

Adult Learning Programs

Our Medical, Dental, and BTPA programs are progressing with an amazing group of motivated students ready to take on the challenge of their new career endeavor.



At the end of December, 21 students took their written state board exam for Radiation Safety. Instructor Debbie Martiniez is proud to share that not only did every student pass, but they excelled! With the first semester complete, students will now be transitioning into the clinical component of the class that will include how to take x-rays.

In addition, students have successfully completed several

certifications up to this point that include Dental Practice Act and Infection Control and BLS CPR. All 21 students are progressing well and look forward to earning their certificate of completion for Radiation Safety X-Ray during the 2nd semester.



Our Dental Assisting program is also proud to announce that the program has recently been approved by the CA Dental Board to be able to offer another certificate in Coronal Polishing. This certification will provide students the opportunity to further their steps toward applying for their Registered Dental Assisting License in the future. This class will also be offered to our local Dental Community as well.

Last, the CALS team successfully submitted our <u>California</u> <u>Apprenticeship Initiative</u> grant application for our Dental Assisting program. If we are selected, this 3 year grant will total \$1.02M and will support us in offering paid on-the-job

training to a total of 68 students over the course of the project.

The BPTA Program is very excited to kick off our 6th cohort for the Building Trades Pre-Apprenticeship program on January 22nd 2024! To date, we have held three sessions at our 399 facility and two at the Rountree facility for the Department of Corrections. We are proud to announce that many of our graduates have found gainful employment as a result of participating in our training program.

The CALS team continues to work closely with the City of Santa Cruz Workforce Development Initiative and participate in monthly meetings centered around expanding our program's outreach to applicants as well as local companies in need of qualified candidates for employment. This fall, the CALS team solidified an agreement with the Local 62 Plumbers union to grant our graduates direct entry into the union upon completion of our program.

In our goal to provide Santa Cruz County a rigorous and relevant building trades program, while maintaining our commitment to the local unions and California's Division of Apprenticeship Standards (DAS), our team is happy to announce our new articulation agreement with <u>Cabrillo College</u>. Students will now have the opportunity to earn Cabrillo College credit and continue their education in the <u>Cabrillo College</u>. <u>Construction and Energy Management (CEM) program</u>.

Although the spring BTPA cohort registration has closed, the program will be looking to recruit applicants for the fall 2024 cohort starting in March.



The Medical Assisting class is excited to be starting the clinical skills component of the program. During the next couple of months, students will apply principles learned from the fall semester, such as pharmacology, pharmacology math, administering medication, and the principles of infection control into real life scenarios. The clinical skills include working

on calculations and conversions for administering injections, practicing intradermal injections using saline solution on one another, and actively using medical terminology. As skills progress, students will participate in a mock clinic in February that will provide a variety of scenarios to troubleshoot.

Sueños is a Santa Cruz County Office of Education (SCCOE) program in partnership with the Workforce Development Board of Santa Cruz County.

Health Science Career Cluster Academy

Prior to winter break, Sueños participants completed the 3-week Health Science Career Cluster Academy. Participants were introduced to careers in Health Science while also experiencing opportunities to explore those careers further through various activities. Youth participated in job shadows, a career panel and developed a Roadmap to their dream job. Not only do participants get exposure to career opportunities they might have not considered before, but they also earn a \$150 incentive for completing the academy.

CAC Updates

<u>The Career Advancement Charter (CAC)</u> is an Independent Study program for adult learners to earn their high school diploma while gaining academic and technical skills that will lead to college and career readiness.



Winter Graduation:

The CAC is happy to announce that in January 36 students graduated with their high school diploma. Family and friends gathered in the Sequoia Schools gym to celebrate the graduates. Dr. Manuel Bersamin, former mayor of Watsonville and current director of the <u>TRiO program at Hartnell College</u>, was the keynote speaker. It was a joy to see the graduates walk and their families celebrate this milestone.



In an effort to better serve our students, the CAC is now implementing a new registration process. New students attend an in person orientation designed to inform new students of all the services and community partnerships that the CAC offers. Orientation is intended to help students be successful from day 1 and beyond.

Welcome CAC New Teacher:

As our CAC program continues to expand, Jennifer Proffitt is helping to serve Independent Study students in our Santa Cruz location. Jennifer is a wonderful addition to our team. She emphasizes human development, prioritizing the developmental needs of her adult students in addition to their academic competency. Jennifer is also hoping to start ESL courses in the Santa Cruz office. She also hopes to contribute to diversity, equity, and inclusion work happening at COE.

ESL Evening Classes:

We continue to offer English as a Second Language (ESL) classes to CAC students and community members. ESL classes are offered every Wednesday and Thursday from 5:30pm to 7:30pm at Sequoia Schools. The advanced level ESL class takes place every Wednesday, and the beginning level ESL class every Thursday. Upon enrollment, students will take an evaluation for placement into a level.



Plazas Comunitarias:

The CAC is proud to continue to partner with Watsonville Public Library (WPL), INEA (Instituto Nacional para la Educación de los Adultos), and the Mexican consulate to offer free basic skills education classes in Spanish. This Spanish literacy program is known as Plaza Comunitaria. Plaza Comunitaria classes help adult learners who have immigrated from a Spanish-speaking country finish or begin their elementary or secondary education in Spanish. In addition, interested students develop the skills necessary to pass high school equivalency exams (GED) in Spanish or to enroll in the CAC as a high school student to earn a high school diploma. Classes are offered at Sequoia Schools in Freedom every Tuesday and Thursday from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. Classes are also offered at the Watsonville Public Library (main branch) every Monday and Wednesday from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. For more information or to enroll call 831-750-5053 or 831-768-3410.





The CAC program partners with the Probation and Corrections Department of Santa Cruz County to support those taking steps to fulfill their high school education. The Probation Success Center or PSC are places where high school teachers offer math, computer literacy, and English classes along with 1-1 tutoring for students to prepare for high school equivalency exams. Students can choose either path for achievement and receive credits towards their high school diploma as they study. The Independent Study program is an integral part since most clients are also using the PSC for other resources such as job searching, counseling, parenting courses, and more.

Evening Child Care:

In an effort to support our adult learner parents, we offer childcare services two days a week. Our childcare operates from 4pm-7pm and accommodates newborn children and children up to five years of age. Our caregivers engage with the children in a variety of learning and enrichment activities.



Adult Learning Enrichment Opportunities:

All students enrolled in the CAC have the opportunity to participate in a variety of evening courses, ranging from Culinary Arts, hands-on math tutoring, ESL support classes, and film analysis and discussion activities. CAC students also have the option to pursue Dual Enrollment or non-credit career education classes at Cabrillo College. Additionally, we are pleased to share that we continue to offer work-readiness and job skills certification opportunities to our students through Certiport.
