Proposition 28, known as the Arts and Music in Schools (AMS) Funding Guarantee and Accountability Act, was approved by California voters on November 8, 2022. This initiative aims to provide consistent annual funding for arts education in K-12 public schools, including charter schools, by allocating an amount equal to 1% of the total state and local revenues received under Proposition 98 from the previous fiscal year. Under this proposition, schools are required to submit annual board-approved reports detailing how funds were spent.

# 7.2 Approve Resolution #24-28 In Support of the City of Santa Cruz's Sugar-Sweetened Beverage Tax Proposal

The Santa Cruz County Board of Education supports a proposal to impose a two-cent per fluid-ounce tax on sugar-sweetened beverages in Santa Cruz. This measure aims to address troubling trends in youth health, such as obesity and diabetes, by reducing the consumption of unhealthy beverages. Modeled after similar successful taxes in other California cities, this initiative could generate up to \$1.3 million annually for essential city services, including youth programs. A Community Oversight Panel would ensure a transparent allocation of the funds towards health and wellness programs benefiting the community.

RE: August Budget Revisions

Notable changes to the budget processed during the month of August 2024 are as follows:

## Unrestricted:

Budget revisions processed reflect no change to revenue and minimal changes to expenditures. Adjustments between supplies and services reflect changes based on programmatic departmental needs.

Budget revisions processed in August result in a decrease to the unrestricted fund balance in the amount of (\$712).

## Restricted:

Budget revisions processed reflect an overall increase in restricted revenues and corresponding expenditures in the amount of \$46,226.

- \$5,340 Classified School Employee Summer Assistance Program (CSESAP) increased State match to 1:1
- \$10,000 Tech+ Stanford Graduate School partnership to support the Artificial Intelligence Literacy Community of Practice (AI CoP)

#### SANTA CRUZ COUNTY OFFICE OF EDUCATION

Bylaws of the Board BB 9150 (a)

#### STUDENT TRUSTEE

In order to enhance communication and collaboration between the Santa Cruz County Board of Education ("the County Board") and the student body, and to teach students the importance of civic involvement, the Board supports the participation of high school students in County Board governance.

Student trustees may, at the County Board's discretion, receive elective course credit for service as a student trustee based on the number of equivalent daily instructional minutes for the student trustee's services provided. (Education Code 1000, 35120)

Student trustee(s) shall be entitled to be reimbursed for mileage to the same extent as other members of the County Board but shall not receive monetary compensation for attendance at Board meetings. (Education Code 1000)

A student trustee shall not be liable for any acts of the County Board. (Education Code 1000)

#### Petition

High school students may submit a petition to the County Board requesting the appointment of at least one student trustee. (Education Code 1000)

To qualify for Board consideration, the petition for student representation shall contain the signatures of at least 500 students or 10 percent of the number of students regularly enrolled in high schools that are under the jurisdiction of the county board, whichever is less. (Education Code 1000)

Within 60 days of receiving a student petition, or at the next regularly scheduled Board meeting if no meeting is held within those 60 days, the County Board shall order the inclusion of at least one student trustee position on the County Board. (Education Code 1000)

## **Choosing or Selecting Student Trustees**

Student trustees shall be chosen by students enrolled in the high school(s) within the county in accordance with procedures prescribed by the County Board.

If the student trustee position is established based on a petition received from the high school(s) under the County Board's jurisdiction, any student chosen shall be enrolled in a high school that is under the jurisdiction of the County Board, with preference given to any student in a school operated by the County Office of Education (Education Code 1000)

Board Adopted: October 20, 2022

## **Student Trustees (Continued)**

BB 9150 (b)

If the County Board does not receive a petition from the high school(s) under its jurisdiction, the County Board may select a student who is enrolled in a high school under the jurisdiction of a school district within the county to serve as a student trustee. (Education Code 1000)

The term of student trustee(s) shall be one year, commencing on July 1. However, the County Board may adjust the term of a student trustee if a vacancy occurs or in order to provide more students an opportunity to serve on the County Board. (Education Code 1000)

#### **Role and Responsibilities of Student Trustees**

Student trustees shall not be considered members of a legislative body for purposes of the Brown Act. (Education Code 1000)

A student trustee shall not be counted in determining the vote required to carry any measure before the County Board or whether a quorum is in attendance at a County Board meeting.

Student trustee(s) shall have the right to attend all Board meetings except closed sessions. (Education Code 1000)

All materials presented to County Board members, except those related to closed sessions, shall be presented to student trustees at the same time they are presented to other County Board members. Student trustee(s) shall also be invited to attend staff briefings, or be provided with a separate staff briefing, within the same timeframe as the briefing of other County Board members. In addition, all materials given to County Board members between meetings, except for materials that pertain to closed session items, shall be distributed to student trustees. (Education Code 1000)

Student trustee(s) shall be recognized at Board meetings as full member(s), shall be seated with other members of the County Board, and shall be allowed to participate in questioning witnesses and discussing issues. (Education Code 1000)

Student trustee(s) shall be allowed to cast preferential votes on all matters except those subject to closed session discussion. Preferential voting means a formal expression of opinion that is recorded in the minutes and cast before the official vote of the County Board. Preferential votes shall not affect the final numerical outcome of a vote. (Education Code 1000)

Student trustee(s) may make motions that may be acted upon by the County Board, except on matters dealing with employer-employee relations pursuant to Government Code 3540-3549.3. (Education Code 1000)

Student trustees shall be appointed to subcommittees of the County Board in the same manner as other County Board members, and shall be made aware of the time commitment required to participate in subcommittee meetings and work and of the right to decline an appointment.

#### **Student Trustees (Continued)**

BB 9150 (c)

The availability of all subcommittee members, including the availability of student trustees, may be considered when scheduling subcommittee meetings. (Education Code 1000)

Student trustees shall be invited to attend functions of the County Board, such as forums, meetings with students and parents/guardians, and other general assemblies. (Education Code 1000)

## **Student Trustee Training**

The County Board may provide learning opportunities to student trustees through trainings, workshops, and conferences, such as those offered by the California School Boards Association and other organizations, to enhance their knowledge, understanding, and performance of leadership skills and their Board responsibilities.

The County Board may periodically provide information to student trustee candidates to give them an understanding of the position. Once chosen or appointed, incoming student trustees shall be provided an orientation designed to build their knowledge and an understanding of the responsibilities and expectations of the position.

Students admitted as trustees shall be eligible for any County Office of Education administered County Office of Education Student Trustee Academy.

Subject to availability, the Board shall/may appoint a mentor to the student trustee.

#### **Alternative Student Trustee**

If the County Board determines that the student trustee's duties are not being fulfilled, the County Board may appoint another student to serve out the term of the student trustee. If an alternate student trustee is appointed, the County Board shall suspend the prior student trustee's rights and privileges related to service on the County Board. (Education Code 1000)

#### **Elimination of Student Trustee Position**

Once established, the student trustee position shall continue to exist until the County Board, by majority vote of all voting County Board members, approves a motion to eliminate the position. Such a motion shall be listed as a public agenda item for a County Board meeting prior to the motion being voted upon. (Education Code 1000)

Yes, I actively participate in various clubs and activities at both the school and county level. I have been a peer tutor at my school for the past two years, tutoring many people in nearly all subjects. I am also the founder and president of the Philosophy Club, and the co-founder and president of the Coding Club, both aimed at introducing subjects that are not officially taught at our school to students. Additionally, I am deeply involved in the school music program as a pianist for the primary jazz ensemble and section leader of mallet percussion in the varsity band, as well as bands outside of school, and have represented my school in the regional CCS Honor Band. I also participate as a Link Crew Leader, welcoming incoming freshmen by designing and giving orientation tours. I have been involved with the Santa Cruz County Office of Education for the past two years, as a student leader working with math coordinator Kevin Drinkard to organize and facilitate county-wide math festivals and contests for young students, and with Multilingual Youth Taking Action with Andres Ortiz to advocate for the education and appreciation of world languages by planning events such as language expos.

8. What interests you about serving on the County School Board? \*

Serving on the County School Board would provide an opportunity to advocate for equitable educational opportunities and support systems for all students, particularly for low-income and minority students. I strongly believe in the freedom to pursue knowledge and ensuring that everyone has access to the resources they need to succeed. I have been pursuing this mission through my role in peer tutoring and involvement with the County Office of Education, and participating with the board is a natural next step in representing my fellow peers and applying my experience to make a greater impact on the county.

9. What do you see as the most pressing issues facing the student population in this county? \*

One of the most pressing issues for students in our county is the disparity in educational options and resources among different regions and demographics. For example, Santa Cruz High and Aptos High offer more AP and advanced courses than other schools in their respective districts, such as Soquel and Pajaro Valley, which represent a higher proportion of low-income and minority students. This limits the opportunities for these students to pursue advanced education. Additionally, many students without adequate resources continuously fall behind as they progress through their education. My experience with the County Office of Education made me realize that implementing and promoting county-wide initiatives like expos and festivals are effective in bringing students together and showcasing various opportunities and resources. I also believe that a greater effort should be placed on offering varied and advanced courses equally at most individual schools. Alternatively, a potentially effective solution is increasing awareness of accessible educational opportunities that already exist, such as dual enrollment through Cabrillo College, which is free for high school students and something I have encouraged several peers to take. As a Latino student, I would like to see more opportunities for language learning in middle schools as well, including options for native Spanish speakers.

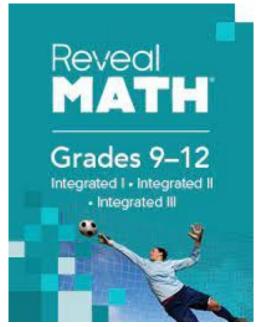
### Request for Resolution

- 1. Teachers inventoried all texts at the close of the 2024 school year. We made appropriate purchases over the summer to meet requests.
- 2. We surveyed teachers again at the start of school, and redistributed any texts as were needed to make sure materials were in the right places. #### RESOLUTION #24-34 SUFFICIENCY OF INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS 2024-2025

**WHEREAS,** Educational Code Section 60119 establishes procedures to ensure the availability of textbooks and instructional materials in order to be eligible to receive funds for that purpose; and

WHEREAS, the procedures require that the governing board shall hold a public hearing before the end of the eighth week from the first day pupils attend school for that year at which the governing board shall encourage participation by parents, teachers, and members of the community interested in the affairs of the Santa Cruz County Office of Education, and bargaining unit leaders, shall decide, by resolution, as to whether each pupil in each school operated by the Santa Cruz County Office of Education has sufficient textbooks, instructional materials, or both, in each of the following subjects, as appropriate, that is consistent with the content and cycles of curriculum framework adopted by the state board:

- 1. Mathematics
- 2. Science
- 3. History-social science
- 4. English/language arts, including the English language development component of an adopted program

WHEREAS, the board shall make a written determination as to whether each pupil enrolled in a foreign language or health course has sufficient textbooks or instructional materials consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum framework of the state board for those subjects. The governing board shall also determine the availability of laboratory science equipment as applicable to science laboratory courses offered in grades nine through twelve, inclusive; and

WHEREAS, "sufficient textbooks or instructional materials" means that each pupil, including English learners, has a textbook or instructional materials, or both, to use in class and to take home. This does not require two sets of textbooks or instructional materials for each pupil. Sufficient textbooks or instructional materials do not include photocopied sheets from only a portion of a textbook or instructional materials copied to address a shortage.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the governing board of the Santa Cruz County Office of Education determines that each pupil of the district has sufficient textbooks and/or instructional materials in each of the above-noted subjects that are consistent with the content cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by the state board, and, further, that each pupil, including English language learners, has a textbook or instructional materials, or both, to use in class and to take home to complete required homework assignments.

- (a) To be eligible for appointment or reappointment to the commission a person shall meet both of the following requirements:
  - (1) Be a registered voter and resident within the territorial jurisdiction of the school district.
  - (2) Be a known adherent to the principle of the merit system. No member of the governing board of any school district or a county board of education shall be eligible for appointment, reappointment, or continuance as a member of the commission. During his or her term of service, a member of the commission shall not be an employee of the school district.
- (b) As used in this section, residence is that place in which his or her habitation is fixed, wherein the person has the intention of remaining, and to which, whenever he or she is absent, the person has the intention of returning. At a given time, a person may have only one residence.
- (c) As used in this section, "known adherent to the principle of the merit system," with respect to a new appointee, means a person who by the nature of his or her prior public or private service has given evidence that he or she supports the concept of employment, continuance in employment, in-service promotional opportunities, and other related matters on the basis of merit and fitness. As used in this section, "known adherent to the principle of the merit system," with respect to a candidate for reappointment, means a commissioner who has clearly demonstrated through meeting attendance and actions that he or she does, in fact, support the merit system and its operation.

One member of the personnel commission shall be appointed by the governing board of the district and one member,

nominated by the classified employees of the district, shall be appointed by the governing board of the district. Those two members shall, in turn, appoint the third member.

As used in this section, "classified employees" shall mean an exclusive representative which represents the largest number of noncertificated employees in a unit or units within the district. If there is no exclusive representative within the district, the governing board shall, by written rule, prescribe the method by which the recommendation is to be made by its classified employees. (a) Within 30 days after adoption of the system, the governing board shall publicly announce its intended appointee or appointees, as appropriate, and the appointee or appointees, as appropriate, nominated by its classified employees. As soon after their appointment as practicable but within 30 days, the appointed members shall announce their intended appointee for the third member. They may consider the recommendations of the governing board, the classified employees, or other concerned citizens. If these members do not announce their intended appointee within the 30-day period, the Superintendent of Public Instruction shall make the appointment.

"Adoption of the system" means, in the case of Section 45221, the day on which a successful election is certified to the governing board or, in the case of Section 45224, the day the governing board approves a motion, order, or resolution to adopt the system regardless of the date specified for operational commencement of the system.

- (b) Where a system is already in existence and a vacancy will exist on December 1, by not later than September 30:
  - (1) The governing board shall publicly announce the name of the person it intends to appoint or reappoint, if the vacancy is its appointee.
  - (2) The appointee of the governing board and the appointee or appointees of the classified employees shall publicly announce the name of the person they intend to appoint, if the vacancy is their appointee.

If the governing board and the classified employees of the district are unable to agree upon a nomination by September 30, the Superintendent of Public Instruction shall make the appointment within 30 days.

- (c) Where a system is already in existence and a vacancy in a position nominated by the classified employees will occur, the classified employees shall submit the name of its nominee to the governing board at least 30 days before the date on which the vacancy will occur and the governing board shall appoint that nominee to be effective on the date on which the vacancy would occur.
- (d) At a board meeting to be held after 30 and within 45 days of the dates specified in subdivision (a) and paragraph (1) of subdivision (b), as the case may be, the governing board in open hearing shall provide the public and employees and employee organizations the opportunity to express their views on the qualifications of those persons recommended by the governing board for appointment.

The board at the time may make its appointment or may make a substitute appointment or recommendation without further notification or public hearing.

In the case of the nominees of the classified employees, the board shall appoint the nominee, unless the classified employees voluntarily withdraw the name of the nominee and submit the name of a new nominee. In the latter case, the board then shall appoint the new nominee.

- (e) If a vacancy exists because of a failure of the classified employees to agree on a nominee, the board may make an emergency appointment as authorized in subdivision (b) of Section 45248. If there is no personnel director, the board nevertheless may make an emergency interim appointment under this subdivision.
- (f) At the next regularly scheduled personnel commission meeting to be held after 30 days from adoption of the system, as specified in subdivision (a), or at the next regularly scheduled personnel commission meeting to be held after 30 days from the day the intended appointee is announced, as specified in paragraph (2) of subdivision (b), as the case may be, the appointee of the governing board and the appointee nominated by the classified employees shall, in an open hearing, provide the public and employees and employee organizations the opportunity to express their views on the qualifications of each candidate recommended for the vacancy. Each candidate shall be invited to this meeting.

The appointee of the governing board and the appointee nominated by the classified employees may make their appointment or may make a substitute appointment or recommendation without further notification or public hearing.

(g) A commissioner whose term has expired may continue to discharge the duties of the office until a successor is appointed, but for no more than 90 calendar days.

Board Policy 6158 (a)

#### INDEPENDENT STUDY

#### **Purpose**

The Santa Cruz County Board of Education (the County Board) authorizes independent study as an optional alternative instructional strategy for pupils whose needs may be best met through study outside of the regular classroom setting. Independent study shall offer a means of individualizing the educational plan to serve pupils who desire a more challenging educational experience, whose health or other personal circumstances make classroom attendance difficult, who are unable to access course(s) due to scheduling problems, and/or who need to make up credits or fill gaps in their learning.

The Superintendent or designee may provide a variety of independent study opportunities, including, but not limited to, through a program or class within a comprehensive school, an alternative school or program of choice, a charter school, and an online course. The County Board recognizes that by offering a range of quality options, including classroom-based, hybrid, and non-classroom based programs, instruction is better tailored to meet pupils' needs, thereby improving academic outcomes.

A pupil's participation in independent study shall be voluntary. (Education Code 51747, 51749.5)

Independent study for each pupil shall be under the general supervision of the principal or designee or a district employee who possesses a valid certification document pursuant to Education Code 44865 or an emergency credential pursuant to Education Code 44300, registered by law. pupils' independent study shall be coordinated, evaluated, and documented, as prescribed by law and reflected in the accompanying administrative regulation. (Education Code 51747.5)

An individual with exceptional needs, as defined in Education Code Section 56026, may participate in independent study, if the pupil's individualized education program (IEP) specifically provides for that participation. If a parent or guardian of an individual with exceptional needs requests independent study, the pupil's individualized education program team shall make an individualized determination as to whether the pupil can receive a free appropriate public education (FAPE) in an independent study placement. A pupil's inability to work independently, the pupil's need for adult support, or the pupil's need for special education or related services shall not preclude the individualized education program team from determining that the pupil can receive a free appropriate education in an independent study placement. (Education Code 51745(c))

#### **BP 6158 Independent Study (Continued) (b)**

A temporarily disabled pupil may receive individual instruction pursuant to Education Code Section 48206.3 through independent study. (*Education Code 51745(d*))

No course required for high school graduation under Section 51225.3 shall be offered exclusively through independent study. (Education Code 51745 (e))

#### **General Independent Study Requirements**

For the 2024-2025 school year and thereafter, the Superintendent or designee may continue to offer and approve independent study for an individual pupil upon determining that the pupil is prepared to meet the district's requirements for independent study and is likely to succeed in independent study as well as or better than the pupil would in the regular classroom setting.

Because excessive leniency in the duration of independent study assignments may result in a pupil falling behind peers and increase the risk of dropping out of school, for all grades and programs in independent study, the maximum length of time which may elapse between the time the assignments are made and the date by which the pupil must complete the assigned work is fifteen for short-term independent study and no more than 20 consecutive school days for long-term independent study. However, when necessary based on the specific circumstances of the pupil's approved program, the Superintendent or designee may allow for a longer period of time between the date an assignment is made and when it is due, up to the termination date of the agreement.

An evaluation shall be conducted to determine whether it is in a pupil's best interest to remain in independent study whenever the pupil fails to make satisfactory educational progress and/or misses four assignments. A written record of the findings of any evaluation made pursuant to this policy shall be treated as a mandatory interim pupil record. The record shall be maintained for a period of three years from the date of the evaluation and, if the pupil transfers to another Califrnia public school, the record shall be forwarded to that school. Satisfactory educational progress shall be determined based on all of the following indicators: (Education Code 51747)

- 1. The pupil's achievement and engagement in the independent study program, as indicated by the pupil's performance on applicable pupil-level measures of pupil achievement and engagement specified in *Education Code* 52060(d)(4)-(5).
- 2. The completion of assignments, assessments, or other indicators that evidence that the pupil is working on assignments
- 3. Learning required concepts, as determined by the supervising teacher

#### **BP 6158 Independent Study (Continued) (c)**

4. Progress towards successful completion of the course of study or individual course, as determined by the supervising teacher

The Superintendent or designee shall provide appropriate existing services and instructional resources to enable pupils to complete their independent study successfully and shall ensure the same access to all existing services and resources in the school in which the pupil is enrolled as is available to all other pupils in the school (*Education Code 51746*). The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that pupils participating in independent study are provided with content aligned to grade level standards that is substantially equivalent to in-person instruction. For high schools, this shall include access to all courses offered by the district for graduation and approved by the University of California or the California State University as creditable under the A–G admissions criteria. (*Education Code 51747*)

Pupils requesting independent study and their parents/guardians should recognize that independent study at the elementary level realistically must emphasize a commitment on the part of the pupil's parents/guardians. At the secondary level, the major commitment must be made by the pupil, assisted or supported as necessary by parents and others who may assist directly with instruction.

## Pupils Participating in Independent Study for 16 School Days or More: Opportunities for Live Interaction and/or Synchronous Instruction, Tiered Reengagement, and Transition to In-Person Instruction

The following three requirements apply to pupils participating in independent study for 16 school days or more in a school year. These requirements do not apply to pupils who participate in an independent study program for fewer than 16 days in a school year and pupils enrolled in a comprehensive school for classroom-based instruction who, under the care of appropriately licensed professionals, participate in independent study due to necessary medical treatments or in-patient treatment for mental health care or substance abuse. The district shall obtain evidence from appropriately licensed professionals of the need for pupils to participate in independent study. pursuant to *Education Code 51747 (i)*.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that pupils participating in independent study for 16 school days or more receive the following throughout the school year: (Education Code 51747)

- 1. For pupils in grades transitional kindergarten, kindergarten, and grades 1 to 3, opportunities for daily synchronous instruction
- 2. For pupils in grades 4-8, opportunities for both daily live interaction and at least weekly synchronous instruction

#### **BP 6158 Independent Study (Continued) (d)**

3. For pupils in grades 9-12, opportunities for at least weekly synchronous instruction

For pupils participating in independent study for 16 school days or more, the Superintendent or designee shall ensure that procedures for tiered reengagement strategies are used for all pupils who are not generating attendance for more than 10 percent of required minimum instructional time over four continuous weeks of the district's approved instructional calendar, are found not participatory in synchronous instructional offerings pursuant to Section 51747.5 for more than 50 percent of the scheduled-times of synchronous instruction in a school month as applicable by grade span, or who are in violation of their written agreement. This requirement only applies to pupils participating in an independent study program for 16 school days or more. These tiered reengagement strategies shall include local programs intended to address chronic absenteeism, as applicable, with at least all of the following:

- 1. Verification of current contact information for each enrolled pupil
- 2. Notification to parents/guardians of lack of participation within one school day of the recording of a nonattendance day or lack of participation
- 3. A plan for outreach from the school to determine pupil needs, including connection with health and social services as necessary
- 4. A clear standard for requiring a pupil-parent-educator conference to review a pupil's written agreement and reconsider the independent study program's impact on the pupil's achievement and well-being, consistent with the adopted policies.

For pupils participating in independent study for 16 school days or more, the Superintendent or designee shall develop a plan to transition pupils whose families wish to return to in-person instruction from independent study expeditiously, and, in no case later, than five instructional days.

#### **Pupil-Parent-Educator Conference**

Before signing a written agreement, the parent or guardian of a pupil may request that the district conduct a telephone, videoconference, or in-person pupil-parent-educator conference or other meeting during which the pupil, parent/guardian, and if requested by the pupil, parent or guardian, an education advocate, may ask questions about the educational options, including which curriculum offerings and nonacademic supports will be available to the pupil in independent study before making the decision about enrollment or disenrollment in the various options for learning. (Education Code 51747(h)(2))

#### BP 6158 Independent Study (Continued) (e)

A pupil-parent-educator conference shall be held as appropriate including, but not limited to, as a re-engagement strategy and/or if requested by a parent or guardian prior to enrollment or disenrollment from independent study. (Education Code 51745.5, 51747, 51749.5)

#### Written Agreement

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that a written master agreement exists for each participating pupil as prescribed by law. (Education Code 51747, 51749.5) Independent study agreements shall include, but not limited to, all of the requirements of Education Code section 51747(g).

For a pupil participating in an independent study program that is scheduled for more than 15 school days, each written agreement shall be signed, before the commencement of independent study, by the pupil, the pupil's parent, legal guardian, or caregiver, if the pupil is less than 18 years of age, the certificated employee who has been designated as having responsibility for the general supervision of independent study, and the certificated employee designated as having responsibility for the special education programming of the pupil, as applicable. (Education Code 51747)

Beginning in the 2024-25 school year, for a pupil participating in an independent study program that is scheduled for less than 16 school days, each written agreement shall be signed during the school year of the pupil's enrollment in independent study, by the pupil, the pupil's parent, legal guardian, or caregiver, if the pupil is less than 18 years of age, the certificated employee who has been designated as having responsibility for the general supervision of independent study, and the certificated employee designated as having responsibility for the special education programming of the pupil, as applicable. (Education Code 51747)

The agreement shall include general pupil data, including the pupil's name, address, grade level, birth date, school of enrollment, and program placement.

The independent study written agreement for each participating pupil also shall include, but is not limited to, all of the following: (Education Code 51747; 5 CCR 11700, 11702)

- 1. The manner, time, frequency, and place for submitting the pupil's assignments, reporting the pupil's academic progress, and communicating with a pupil's parent/guardian regarding the pupil's academic progress
- 2. The objectives and methods of study for the pupil's work and the methods used to evaluate that work

#### BP 6158 Independent Study (Continued) (f)

- 3. The specific resources, including materials and personnel, that will be made available to the pupil. Resources include confirming or providing access to connectivity and devices adequate to participate in the educational program and complete assigned work
- 4. A statement of the County Board's policies detailing the maximum length of time, by grade level and type of program, allowed between an assignment and its completion, the level of satisfactory educational progress, and the number of missed assignments allowed before an evaluation to determine whether it is in the best interests of the pupil to continue in independent study
- 5. The duration of the independent study agreement, including the beginning and ending dates for the pupil's participation in independent study under the agreement, with a maximum of one school year
- 6. A statement of the number of course credits or, for the elementary grades, other measures of academic accomplishment appropriate to the agreement, to be earned by the pupil upon completion
- 7. A statement detailing the academic and other supports that will be provided to address the needs of pupils who are not performing at grade level, or need support in other areas, such as English learners, pupils with disabilities with an individualized education program or a Section 504 plan in order to be consistent with their program or plan, pupils in foster care or experiencing homelessness, and pupils requiring mental health supports.
- 8. A statement that independent study is an optional educational alternative in which no pupil may be required to participate
- 9. In the case of a suspended or expelled pupil who is referred or assigned to any school, class, or program pursuant to *Education Code 48915 or 48917*, a statement that instruction may be provided to the pupil through independent study only if the pupil is offered the alternative of classroom instruction

Written agreements may be signed using an electronic signature that complies with state and federal standards, as determined by the California Department of Education (CDE). (Education Code 51747)

The parent/guardian's signature on the agreement shall constitute permission for the pupil to receive instruction through independent study.

#### **Records for Audit Purposes**

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that records are maintained for audit purposes. These records shall include, but not be limited to: (Education Code 51748; 5 CCR 11703)

- 1. A copy of the County Board policy, administrative regulation, and other procedures related to independent study
- 2. A listing of the pupils, by grade level, program, and school, who have participated in independent study, along with the units of the curriculum attempted and completed by pupils in grades K-8 and the course credits attempted by and awarded to pupils in grades 9-12 and adult education
- 3. A file of all agreements, with representative samples of each pupil's work products bearing the supervising teacher's notations indicating that the teacher has personally evaluated the work or personally reviewed the evaluations made by another certificated teacher
- 4. As appropriate to the program in which the pupils are participating, a daily or hourly attendance register that is separate from classroom attendance records, maintained on a current basis as time values of pupil work products judged by a certificated teacher, and reviewed by the supervising teacher if they are two different persons
- 5. Appropriate documentation of compliance with the teacher-pupil ratios required by Education Code 51745.6 and 51749.5 (Education Code 51745.6 and 51749.5)
- 6. Appropriate documentation of compliance with the requirements pursuant to Education Code 51747.5 to ensure the coordination, evaluation, and supervision of the independent study of each pupil by a district employee who possesses a valid certification document pursuant to Education Code 44865 or an emergency credential pursuant to Education Code 44300 (Education Code 51747.5)

The district shall document each pupil's participation in live interaction and synchronous instruction pursuant to Education Code 51747 on each school day, as applicable, in whole or in part, for which independent study is provided. A pupil who does not participate in independent study on a school day shall be documented as non participatory for that school day. (Education Code 51747.5)

The Superintendent or designee also shall maintain a written or computer-based record such as a grade book or summary document of pupil engagement, for each class, of all grades, assignments, and assessments for each pupil for independent study assignments. (Education Code 51747.5)

The signed, dated agreement, any supplemental agreement, assignment records, work samples, and attendance records may be maintained on file electronically. (Education Code 51747).

#### RESOLUTION #24-36 PROCLAIMING OCTOBER AS LGBTQ+ HISTORY MONTH

**WHEREAS,** LGBTQ+ History Month is an annual, month-long observance of lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender history, and the history of the gay rights and related civil rights movements, which was founded in 1994 by Missouri high-school history teacher, Rodney Wilson; and

**WHEREAS**, on July 14, 2011, the Fair, Accurate, Inclusive and Respectful (FAIR) Education Act was passed and signed into law in California and mandates the inclusion of the political, economic, and social contributions of lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender people in the social studies and history curricula in California public schools; and

**WHEREAS**, on July 14, 2016, the California State Board of Education passed a new History Social Science Framework that includes LGBTQ+ American history content to be taught in K-12 classrooms; and

WHEREAS, all students deserve to feel safe and welcome in their schools and to see themselves represented in the curricula; and

**WHEREAS**, a number of LGBTQ+ history events and people of all races have contributed to the history of equality for all people; and

**WHEREAS**, Sylvia Rivera and Martha P. Johnson, two trans women of color, were some of the significant individuals who stood up for LGBTQ+ Rights at the Stonewall Riots in New York in 1969; and

WHEREAS, Harvey Milk was the first openly gay elected official in the history of California; and

WHEREAS, LGBTQ+ community members across Santa Cruz County have made significant contributions to our community including Senator John Laird who was the first openly gay elected official in Santa Cruz County, Councilmember Jimmy Dutra in Watsonville, Former Mayor Donna Meyers in Santa Cruz, Cabrillo College Trustees Adam Spickler and Steve Trujillo, and many other public officials across the county; and

WHEREAS, local LGBTQ+ activists and allies for more than 45 years have persevered to transform the annual Pride marches from tense rallies needing police and parade monitor protection into one of Santa Cruz's most joyful and beloved community celebrations; and

WHEREAS, the local LGBTQ+ community and its allies rose up to meet the challenge of the AIDS epidemic, helped lead the state and nation in developing community-based strategies for reducing pain and suffering, and took major roles in statewide resistance to political attacks on people with AIDS, including teachers, all despite suffering great and unrecoverable losses of friends and loved ones; and

**WHEREAS**, LGBTQ+ individuals continue to make noteworthy and important contributions to American history, culture and society; and

**WHEREAS**, the County Board of Education supports the rights, freedoms and equality of those who are lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, questioning, intersex, pansexual, and asexual (LGBTQ+); and

**WHEREAS**, the County Board of Education affirms its role in, and commitment to, continuing the historical process of transforming the educational system to ensure inclusiveness, safety, and a sense of belonging for all LGBTQ+ students, teachers, staff, and their families; and

**WHEREAS**, the County Board of Education recognizes the important contributions of local, State, and National LGBTQ+ people to the history of the United States, by promoting social justice, enhancing health and well-being, and building a sense of community for LGBTQ+ people; and

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the County Board of Education celebrates the accomplishments of LGBTQ+ people in history, encourages all schools to celebrate October as LGBTQ+ History Month, and encourages teachers to teach lessons about LGBTQ+ history in their classrooms aligned with the State History Framework, not just in October but all year long.
